



We blend traditional academic subjects with real-world inquiry-based learning and investigation to develop analytical, critical and creative thinking skills, and an affinity for problem solving. CIS students are prepared for the innovation economy of the 21st century.

Our curriculum is not exclusively Canadian - it draws from the best curricula globally, and is delivered within the International Baccalaureate (IB) framework. 

LEARNING

We combine state-of-the-art classrooms, learning pods, and other learning spaces to support our inquiry-based approach, and to encourage a strong sense of community. Whether it is a science lab or an instructional bakery, our intentional approach to school design ensures we meet the educational and developmental needs of all our students.

LIBRARIES

Our well stocked junior, primary and secondary libraries provide students with access to a wide range of age appropriate resources, both print and digital. Our collection of foreign language books is vast, supporting several mother tongue languages, our language acquisition programmes, and our bilingual programmes.

ARTS

Arts spaces include fully equipped visual arts, drama and dance studios, a 500-seat auditorium, a black box theatre, music rooms, digital film studio, digital media studio, arts makerspace and an audio-visual suite.

SPORTS

Our students have access to a variety of outstanding sporting facilities including three tennis courts, a 50-metre swimming pool, a 25-metre junior pool, a learn-to-swim pool, two gymnasiums, indoor basketball courts, an aerobics room, a weights room and a football field.

MAKERSPACES

The majority of our STEAM activities are carried out in dedicated makerspaces and the secondary STEAM centre. Equipped with a range of state-of-the-art tools, these spaces encourage teamwork, collaboration and innovative design thinking through hands-on exploration. See page 26 to learn more about STEAM.

OUTDOOR DISCOVERY CENTRE

Our outdoor discovery centre (ODC) has been designed to connect learning to the outdoors. An extension of our indoor classrooms, this unique space encourages kindergarten and primary students to explore the outdoors and foster a strong connection to nature. Key features include a mud kitchen, sound and literacy gardens, an eco pond, an art wall or pod, a natural tunnel, grassy hills, a bike track and a play fort.

Curriculum and teaching approach.

Today's students are in a unique position; they are the first generation to face a world where exam results alone no longer dictate success. Success in a global environment more than ever before will require not only the ability to come up with fresh and original ideas, but the focus and dedication to turn those ideas into action.

CIS is one of the few international schools in Singapore to offer all three International Baccalaureate (IB) programmes, from the Primary Years Programme (PYP) through to the Diploma Programme (DP). Our curriculum, developed within the IB framework, is benchmarked against leading globally recognised national curricula, to meet or exceed their standards. Keeping our curriculum at the forefront of best practices ensures we foster the development of 21st century skills, and build in students an entrepreneurial mindset - essential for an innovation economy.

Learning at CIS is transdisciplinary in nature, meaning it focuses on issues that go across subject areas, and incorporates local and global issues into the curriculum where possible. Our teachers blend traditional academic subjects with real-world inquiry-based learning and investigation in order to develop a student's ability to problem solve, to think critically and creatively, and to innovate and explore.

Languages.

As an international school, we value our community's linguistic diversity and are committed to promoting multilingualism. Our students come from over 78 nations, and our language offerings are designed to develop proficiency in an additional language and promote the understanding of other cultures.

Students have a choice of two language pathways at CIS: the English programme (which has daily language lessons) or a bilingual programme in Chinese or French (see page 22 to 25 for more details). Daily language lessons in the English programme start in pre-kindergarten. Students are taught by highly qualified language teachers in classes that cater to their abilities.

Students whose first language is not English will be supported through a comprehensive English language learner (ELL) programme.

A range of mother tongue and additional language classes such as Chinese, Japanese, French and Spanish are available in the activities programme after school. These classes are offered by external providers and do incur a fee.

Chinese-English bilingual programme.

CIS's pioneering bilingual Chinese-English programme is designed to allow students in pre-kindergarten to grade 6 to be fluent communicators in both languages.

The programme is fully aligned with the IB PYP and includes two qualified teachers per class: one native English speaker and one native Chinese speaker. Students attend classes in English one day, and in Chinese the next, ensuring equal exposure to both languages.

Intensive Chinese language acquisition classes are taught five times each week by separate native-speaking teachers with students grouped according to their proficiency levels.

During all classes, a strong focus is placed on integrating culture as research demonstrates that speaking a language without understanding its culture has very little real-world value. A specific pathway is available for students to maintain their Chinese in secondary school.

French-English bilingual programme.

CIS's French-English bilingual programme, offered to students in junior kindergarten to grade 6*, is designed to allow students to be fluent communicators in both languages, providing them with an edge in an extremely competitive and ever-changing world.

Fully aligned with the IB PYP, students enjoy equal exposure to both languages. Each class has two fully qualified teachers: a native French speaker and a native English speaker. They also have two classrooms, one for each language, to ensure children are completely immersed in the target language.

During all classes, a strong focus is placed on integrating culture as research demonstrates that speaking a language without understanding its culture has very little real-world value.

STEAM.

STEAM at CIS is an engaging interdisciplinary approach that integrates the areas of science, technology, environmental studies, arts and mathematics. Unlike traditional teaching models where these subjects are taught independently, STEAM supports our students' natural curiosity and creativity, helping them to understand how each discipline is connected and related to the real world.

Our STEAM approach helps students make connections across subject areas. It is integrated across the school from kindergarten to grade 10. We focus on activities where students have the opportunity to make connections and solve real-life, authentic problems. This not only helps them to think critically and approach problems from multiple perspectives, it also keeps them motivated and excited to learn more.

Most of the time, students are exposed to STEAM experiences in our stimulating makerspaces. These are special areas where our students build and work on projects together, using equipment that is both traditional (eg wood working machinery and sewing machines) and cutting edge (eg makerbot 3D printers, GCC laser engravers and cutting machines).

CIS has a thriving and vibrant arts programme which is an essential component of school life. Arts learning helps our students explore, shape and communicate their sense of identity and understanding of the world, while developing creativity, self confidence, resilience and adaptability.

Visual arts, music and drama are incorporated into the nursery to grade 8 curriculum.

Students' artwork is showcased through the school on a regular basis, and visual arts exhibitions are hosted regularly throughout the year.



Activities.

Activities at CIS are a vital part of school life and student learning. Activities are offered across three terms each school year and consist of extracurricular activities (ECAs), co-curricular activities (CCAs - secondary only) and competitive sports. Available to students from senior kindergarten to grade 12, opportunities are wide in scope and allow students to discover and develop individual talents and passions.

Extracurricular activities are grouped into categories: recreational sports, arts, enrichment, languages and STEAM. In addition to recreational sports, our

students have a range of competitive sports options to choose from throughout the school year. CIS have their own representative sports teams who compete against other international schools in a variety of international school leagues. Swimming is a yearlong competitive activity, with registration and trials twice yearly.

In primary school, free cocurricular activities are integrated into our curriculum and are part of the school day. Extra-curricular activities, a paid service hosted by external providers, are offered to primary students after school.

Learning outdoors provides students with meaningful experiential learning opportunities far beyond the traditional confines of the classroom.

Our students develop a sense of independence, collaboration, resilience and responsibility as they engage with the real world and learn about local, regional, global and environmental issues in and outside the classroom.



THE OUTDOOR **DISCOVERY CENTRE**

Much more than just a playground, our outdoor discovery centre (ODC) is an extension of our indoor classrooms, filled with textures, sounds and smells unique to the outdoors.

Our ODC includes purposebuilt spaces where children can interact with nature and run around, as well as areas where they can develop literacy skills and learn important science and math concepts, such as measurement and volume.



OPEN MINDS

Primary students in grades 1 to 6 spend up to four days in a variety of real world settings. Investigation topics are linked to both our curriculum and the units of inquiry (UOI) found within the Primary Years Programme (PYP). Firsthand experience with the environment, artifacts, field experts, and opportunities to go behind the scenes create unique moments of extremely powerful hands-on, minds-on learning.



EXCURSION WEEK

Excursion week sees students in grades 4 to 11 exploring countries such as Singapore, Indonesia, Malaysia, Cambodia and Nepal with their teachers and peers. Distance travelled is age appropriate. The experience provides students with a unique opportunity to experience learning in the field and to develop a sense of independence, an understanding of global issues, and other people and communities.

DP FIELDWORK

Some DP courses require students to go out into the field to conduct research. The objective is to expand, reinforce and extend concepts and skills that are taught in class. Field work provides students with a unique opportunity to apply their investigative, analytical and organisational skills in a real world setting.

Outreach and leadership.

We value the connections we have with one another as a school community, as well as those we cultivate locally, regionally and globally. We are committed to promoting conversations about positive change, but more importantly, we believe in taking action.

The two arms of outreach at CIS are: local outreach, where students connect with members of the Singapore community; and global outreach, where they work with regional NGOs and partner organisations, actively addressing the issues they care about.

Our students from kindergarten to grade 12 are provided with meaningful opportunities to engage in outreach and practise leadership skills, in preparation for life beyond CIS. Through classroom investigations, community partnerships and other projects, they actively seek ways to contribute and give back. This approach fosters empathy as students develop an understanding of the challenges the world's people and environments face.




In today's world, literacy has evolved beyond its basic definition of knowing how to read and write. Everyone

is required to know how to process, deliver and receive information in today's highly digitalised world. It is inevitable that the definition of literacy includes components of digital literacy, which emphasises the ability to use digital technology, communication tools and networks to locate, evaluate, use and create information. Learning experiences are made richer by the appropriate use of technology, and skills learnt are directly transferable to the workplace.

Pastoral care.

Meeting the broad needs of our learners school-wide is important. Our principals, counsellors, teachers and advisors work together to safeguard our students' personal and academic wellbeing. Our house system builds a sense of belonging and pride, and the secondary SMART programme provides opportunities for academic support and guidance.



HOMEROOM TEACHERS

In **kindergarten** and **primary school**, homeroom teachers are responsible for providing our students with strong pastoral and emotional support. They guide students in their learning, and help them develop important skills including goal setting, self management, study skills and conflict resolution. Our counsellors and principals support our teachers and students as needed.



ADVISORY PROGRAMME

In secondary school, each student is assigned an advisor whom they meet each morning. Advisors are a student's first point of contact, and are responsible for providing them with strong pastoral and emotional support. In addition to delivering the pastoral curriculum at each grade level, our advisors are instrumental in assisting their students with goal setting, time management, exam practice and study skills.



COUNSELLING

Our school psychologist and experienced team of counsellors work in close partnership with advisors and teachers, providing students with individual support for a diverse range of needs including academic and career guidance (curriculum advice, career planning, assistance with university applications) and personal and social assistance (crisis intervention, transition planning, conflict management, friendship difficulties).

HOUSES

Our house system is designed to build a strong sense of community and pride within our student body from grades 1 to 6. House activities encourage the development of leadership and teamwork skills. Students regularly participate in house events, and our house captains are charged with helping to foster team spirit and a sense of belonging.

SMART

Each day for 40 minutes, secondary students are engaged in SMART (Students Maximising Achievement Responsibility and Time). **SMART** sees students participating in a variety of student-initiated activities that seek to encourage independence and selfdirected learning. Activities are broad in nature and include academic enrichment and support, as well as student-led clubs and initiatives such as student council and Model United Nations.



UNIFORMS

IPADS AND MACBOOKS

Devices are required for your child's first day of school. The most recent operating system must be installed.

In grades 3 to 6, students must bring their own iPad to school every day. Recommendations include:
